

OCEANIA MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Oceania Squash Federation is currently researching the history of the Oceania Masters Championships.

The first Oceania Masters Squash Championships were held in 1993 and was hosted on an annual basis by Member Countries, until 2014. With it becoming more difficult each year to secure a host country there were no Masters Championships held from 2015 to 2019.

At the 2019 Annual General Meeting it was agreed the Masters Championships should be reintroduced, but held every 2 years rather than annually, in the alternate year to the Oceania Closed Championships. It was recognised that travel across the Pacific was becoming more expensive and holding the Closed and Masters Championships in alternate years would be more financially viable for both hosts and players alike.

The 2020 Masters Championships were scheduled to be hosted by New Caledonia, but unfortunately due to the Covid19 Pandemic this event was cancelled. Consequently the rescheduled 2022 event was also cancelled.

The next Oceania Masters Championships are scheduled to be held in 2024, which a host to be announced early 2023.
