PNG POWER TO POWER THE GAMES

Electricity provider PNG Power will guarantee electricity to Games Venues during the 2015 Games. This was as a result of the State Owned company coming on board to support the Games as a platinum sponsor. PNG Power will be providing a Value-In Kind sponsorship to the Games at the value of K6.5million. This will include electricity connection to Games venues, standby generators and operational support required for service and maintaining generators and related infrastructure during Games time. Chief Executive Officer of the Games Organising Committee Peter Stewart said, GOC is pleased to have PNG Power bring the number of SOE's to join the Games family to 3. This reflects the overall government commitment to the Games. He said, while the Government has given substantial funds for the 2015 Games, much of this is going for infrastructure development and therefore the sponsorship from sponsors like PNG Power Limited is very much welcomed. "The GOC note and appreciate that the National Government is doing all it can to ensure power outage problems in Port Moresby is resolved as the games will rely heavily on PNG Power and its supply of electricity, especially for the many events that are scheduled for the evenings. Given the high-tech nature of modern games, constant and effective power supply is a must for the Games and what PNG Power has provided through this sponsorship is a signifi-

Games Join in Fight Against Malaria

The 2015 Pacific Games team joined stakeholders to commemorate World Malaria Day on the 25th of April, with the launch of the National Malaria Control Strategic Plan 2014-2018 at Kemabolo village in the Rigo district of Central province. GOC CEO Peter Stewart told partners that the Games will be a celebration of healthy living and making sure people stay healthy from diseases like Malaria. Tura was involved in the NCD float malaria campaign.

A project team comprising Telikom engineers from various disciplines will implement the project in three different phases. Currently the project is in its planning and design stage. The next phase will be implementation and testing and the final stage is operation and monitoring. Telikom came on board as a platinum sponsor for the Games and the sponsorship covers the project. As the telicommunications provider for the 2015 Pacific Games, Telikom will provide broadband internet access and telephone services to all venues and broadcast centres for the Games. The 2015 Pacific Games will be televised live and the work of the project team will ensure other centres throughout the country and the region watch the games on television.

Barramundi's Team of the Year

The PNG Mens Cricket team, the Barramundi's are a champion team who have achieved a lot as a team. The most recent achievements see the Barramundi's win the ICC's East Asia Pacific's Men's Trophy, the Asia Pacific Rising Stars trophy and the inaugural South Australia Premier league T20 Cup by finishing 8th out of 16 countries in the ICC world Cup T20 Qualifiers. Among the teams achievements this year was their participation in the ICC World Cup Qualifiers in New Zealand where they finished 4th in the Super 6 stage, with the top 2 teams to qualify for the World Cup. In that series, the Barramundi's beat higher rated countries like Namibia and Kenya to finish in the 4th place. Barramundi's Captain Chris Amini says the team is in full swing preparing for the 2015 Games. "We started our intensive training last month and will keep it up until next year. We're obviously favourites for the Gold medal but won't take any team lightly and we're very determined on keeping our 100% gold medal haul intact for next year". In recognition of their achievements Barramundi's were named Team of the year in this years SP Awards.
